Dear Families

Welcome to 2020!

It has been the most challenging of summers and a really interesting start to the year. We know that so many of our community have been impacted either by the fires, the smoke or the hailstorm and that repairs and recovery in some cases are still ongoing. I have to say that last week it was just so lovely to have the children start and to have many aspects of our life get back into routine. Even with the difficult summer, most everyone has made a smooth start. I have also loved meeting our children and families who are new to our community. Welcome! We are really thrilled to be working with your child and with you this year. Learning is our priority at Southern Cross and to do that effectively we also need to work closely with our families. Your expert knowledge of your child is so crucial to us being the best school and the best teachers that we can be.

Team Professional Learning

The week before the children returned was spent in professional learning for the whole staff team. We had two full days together, the first of which was working with literacy expert Catherine Nash on how we can be better teachers of writing. It was interesting, as Catherine got us to do some writing and helped us to see the importance of being writers ourselves as we teach children to write. There is so much for children to learn as they learn to write including what are letters and what sounds they make, how to form the letters, how to put letters together to make words, how you get your thoughts together to get them down on paper and what kids of words you need for particular types of writing. It is no wonder that sometimes our children go home very tired! Our teachers will be working with you to set writing goals for your child so that you can track their progress over the year in this area.

Our second day was to revisit our work in Inquiry Learning with Kath Murdoch. We had a refresher in the inquiry cycle and learnt about the learning assets that help us to be better learners. We focussed on how to be a researcher, thinker, collaborator, self-manager and communicator. We will have more information in future newsletters about the learning assets over the term, so stay tuned.

Our Cultural Integrity journey will continue over the year as we build on our action research we undertook last year. We continue to have a focus about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander education and culture, looking at how we can embed quality and meaningful practice in this area into our own learning and our teaching.

New Staff

We welcome three new staff members to our community this year. Sarah Hornby has joined us on preschool, Dee Munro has joined us in Years 1 and 2 and Emma Muffet has joined us as our Acting Business Manager. Please join me in welcoming them to the Southern Cross team.

Any questions?

At the start of the year it can be tricky to remember everything. We have information on our website and on our Facebook page – when you have a moment you might want to check out both sites. The teachers also include information on our SeeSaw app so you can be connected to your child's learning. We also have other supports. Jason Thornton is our Community Coordinator and has a wealth of knowledge and experience to support families. You could also ask a question of Emma, our Business Manager and Nicole at reception as they both are really helpful. Or you can ask any of the executive, teachers or educators. If we do not know the answer we will try to find out and get back to you ASAP. If you have any worries or concerns then please talk to your child's teacher.

Staff Meetings

Please note that our staff meetings are on Wednesdays straight after school and the Kinder to Year 2 teachers have their team meetings on Tuesdays, also straight after school. If you need to touch base with your child's teacher Monday, Thursday and Friday are best for children in Kinder to Year 2. Monday and Tuesday are the best for beginning of the week preschool and Thursday and Friday are the best for end of the week preschool.

Air Quality

We were so happy last week to take delivery of seven Dyson Pure Cool™ purifying fans to use across our school. Our sincere thanks to Dyson Australia for their amazing support of Canberra Public Schools and to the Torrens Primary School dad who first contacted Dyson. To place the fans, we have prioritised the rooms without access to any filtered air and then also looked to support our most vulnerable children across the school. For families with sensitive children, please remember to update your child's asthma plan and also talk to your child's teacher or educator should you need individual arrangements in place for your child.

SMS Absence Notifications

Southern Cross Early Childhood School will be sending an SMS to inform families of student absences. You will receive an SMS to let you know your child has been recorded as absent on the morning of their absence. We will endeavour to send this message by 10.30am every day. This will reassure you of your child's arrival at school and make it easier for you to keep your child's attendance record up to date when they are absent.

You simply reply via SMS, with your child's name and the reason for your child's absence, your reply will be saved directly onto your child's attendance record. If you do not reply, your child's absence will be recorded as 'unexplained'.

For **unexpected absences**, responding to the SMS will streamline our processes.

For **planned absences**, we would still appreciate advanced notice of your child's absence, please notify your class teacher or Nicole at reception.

Dee Munro

My name is Dee and this is my second year teaching. I am loving getting to know the children at Southern Cross, and learning with the 1/2s in Ghaddi. I have just moved to Canberra from the Far South Coast, where my family (mum, dad, brother and dog) all live.



Linking Families to Learning - How do the teachers at Southern Cross expect my child to do his or her best?

Relationships are key to many aspects of our work with children at Southern Cross. Once children know that we are interested in them and care about them, then they are more likely to take chances with their learning and share what they know. As Dr James Comer says "No significant learning occurs without a significant relationship". Teachers use many different strategies to understand where children are at with their learning. These strategies could include observations, anecdotal reports, checklists, assessment tasks, discussions, data, learning journals and reports. Every day teachers are building and growing their understanding of your child and where they are with their learning and development.

Once your child's teacher has some information, they work out what the next steps are, framed by the Early Years Learning Framework for preschool and the Australian Curriculum for Kindergarten to Year 2, to help your child

progress. Detailed feedback during learning helps your child to know what the next steps are or how they can improve their learning. Goal setting is a crucial part of this process and we are working to make our learning visible across the school. This will look different across the years but children will develop with their teachers (and sometimes with you) individual, small group or class goals for their learning. They will then be supported to progress their learning to meet that goal.

As parents and carers, you hold such a comprehensive understanding of your child that often teachers will call on your knowledge of your child to help them in some areas. This is why our Getting to Know You interviews and staying connected over the term are so important. Each term your child's teacher will send out a term overview which will help you know what learning is planned for the term. We also contact families when we are developing Individual Learning Plans (ILP's) and Personalised Learning Plans (PLP's) for children requiring additional support. Should you think that there is a mismatch between your expectations and the teacher's expectations then please talk to your child's teacher as soon as possible so that we can work through the issue.

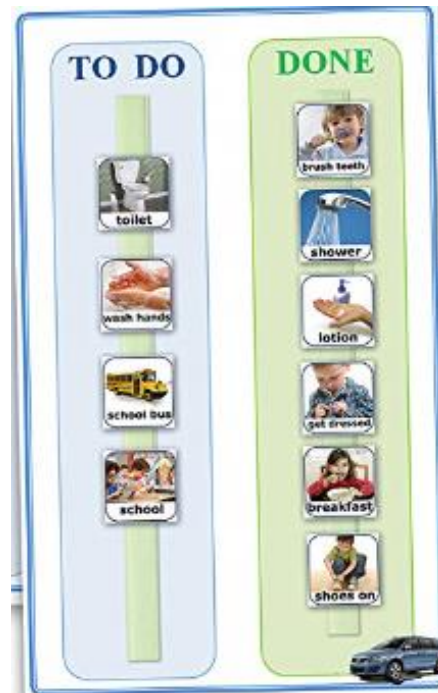

Helpful Hints for Home

Welcome back to a new year of learning together at school and home. This section of the newsletter is designed to give families ideas on ways to support their child at home with their learning. We often get asked questions from families on ways to help with reading, writing, numeracy and social and emotional learning. Each fortnight a different topic with helpful hints will be covered.

The beginning of the school year can sometimes bring big emotions for our children and this could result in the morning drop off being emotional for your child and also yourself. Here are some ways you could help to support your child to have the most positive start to the day.

- Have a set routine in the morning, this could also include a routine when you get to school. Talk about this with your child to see what routine makes a positive morning for them and you.
- Use a visual timetable for the morning this could be something your child marks off when they have completed it.



- They could bring a photo of their family in if they need something to be able to see you.
- Get your child to help with packing their lunch box allow some choice in what they have to eat for the day, for example banana, apple or grapes or sandwich, wrap or salad.
- Start to develop their independence by getting your child to pack their bag. Start by having all the things they need and get them to problem solve where it will all fit.
- Let them know (if possible) when any routine for the morning or afternoon pick up is going to be different so they know what to expect.
- Remember our teachers are out for Morning Muster at 8.55am, so if the morning has been a little different or unsettled touch base with them.

Nature Preschool - Walga

Anglicare is currently running a new Nature Preschool Program, called Walga, for preschool aged children. The program is tailored for children who require care for their alternate Wednesday that they are not attending Southern Cross preschool. This program runs during ACT school terms, and vacation care is available for families to enrol in during the school holidays. Included in our curriculum, is a dedicated nature program, meaning that regardless of the weather we venture outdoors into Canberra's very own classroom.

Natasha (our OOSH coordinator) along with Elana and Mel (Educational Leader), plan and run the program for a group of preschool aged children each Wednesday, using research from education theorists such as Froebel, Steiner, Vygotsky and Montessori, all who put the child at the centre of their own learning. An influential theorist that guides our bio ecological style of learning is Bronfenbrenner, who believes that a person's development is affected by everything in their surrounding environment.

We currently have spaces for children who attend preschool during the Wednesday, Thursday, Friday end of the week (Bunduluk and Dnnawan).
