SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

Public schools in the ACT use a five-year **School Improvement Plan** to ensure improved student learning outcomes for all children. Our two key priorities are:

- Improve literacy growth for all learners.
- Improve numeracy growth for all learners.

Principals and leadership teams also write an **Action Plan** each year that details the actions that schools engage in to ensure improved student learning outcomes. At the end of each year, Principals write an **Impact Report** that demonstrates improvement towards achieving the goals in the five-year Improvement Plan. Our Impact Report will be up on our school website soon, once it is approved by the Education Directorate. I would encourage you all to take a look at our wonderful results! In the meantime, I would like to share some of our improved learning data with you:

BASE Kindergarten Data – Reading- In Kindergarten, the number of children who made expected or above expected growth was 84% in 2022. This is a significant increase from 2018.

BASE Kindergarten Data – Numeracy- In Kindergarten, the number of children who made expected or above expected growth was 91% in 2022. Again, this is a significant increase from 2018.

We are so proud of all our learners, and I am so proud of all our staff and the achievements they have made.

SCHOOL REVIEW

A part of the School Improvement agenda is to engage in a School Review process following a five-year School Improvement Plan. Southern Cross Early Childhood School will go through a review process in week 8 term 1 this year.

A School Review panel, made up of one ACER representative and two ACT Education Directorate Principals, will be here at our school for the formal review process. The panel will read documentation prepared by our school leadership team, talk to children, staff and families, and will then provide us with commendations and recommendations that will inform our next five-year School Improvement Plan.

We are excited for the rich, strategic feedback that we will gain from this experience and look forward to working with the panel to establish our next five-year Improvement Plan.

ABSENCE NOTIFICATIONS

If your child is away from school, you will receive an SMS to let you know your child has been recorded as absent. We will endeavour to send this message by 10.30am every day. This will reassure you of your child's arrival at school and make it easier for you to keep your child's attendance record up to date when they are absent.

Simply reply via SMS, with your child's name and the reason for your child's absence, your reply will be saved directly onto your child's attendance record. If you do not reply, your child's absence will be recorded as 'unexplained'.


- For **unexpected absences**, responding to the SMS will notify the school and be placed directly onto your child's attendance record.
- For **late arrival**, you may still receive an SMS in the morning, please sign in at reception and your child's attendance record will be updated to a partial attendance for that day.
- For planned absences, we would still appreciate advanced notice of your child's absence.

READING IN YEAR 1/2


Across year one and two, children have engaged in setting up class expectations for Reader's Workshop. They have been working on how to choose a good fit book.

This includes:

- How to choose a good fit book. The IPICK and 5 finger rule examples support us with this.
- Identifying what it looks like, and sounds like to be a good reader.







Children have discussed what good readers do and strategies that can be used to help when reading.

There has been a daily focus on increasing our reading stamina. Daily practise has already seen our classes increase from 30 seconds to over 5 minutes of uninterrupted, dedicated reading. Our goal is reach 20 minutes of independent reading.

Help us reach this goal by practising these things at home too!

CHILD DEVELOPMENT SERVICE REFERRAL INFORMATION

The ACT Government's Child Development Service assists families who live in the ACT and have concerns about their

0-6-year-old child's development. This may include concerns about a child developing skills slower than others of the same age in areas such as, speech and language, movement, hand skills, self-care, and social development. Parents and guardians can refer their child to the Child Development Service. With parent/ guardian permission, others may make a referral, including early childhood educators, teachers, GPs, nurses, paediatricians and case workers.
