Reconciliation Courtyard – In the near future there will be works occurring in the Reconciliation Courtyard. COVID SMART REMINDER

As you may be aware, there has been an increase in COVID-19 cases across ACT public schools in recent weeks.

To help stop the further spread of COVID-19 in our school, we are encouraging and implementing the following measures:

- Students who are COVID-19 positive or displaying symptoms (including a runny nose, sore throat, cough, fever) should test and must not attend school while unwell.
- Parents and carers must inform schools if their child is COVID-positive.
- Keep up to date with vaccinations.
- Families can access a free rapid antigen test from the front office of their school. Test when symptomatic or as a precaution.
- Practise good hand and respiratory hygiene.
- Distance where possible.

STRANGER AWARENESS SAFETY

This is a reminder to ensure your children and young people understand the importance of stranger awareness safety and information has been included on how to report an incident.

Please support us to keep our children safe by having conversations about moving safely around the community. You may wish to visit the Australian Federal Police website section on <u>Child Safety</u> for tips. In addition, the <u>Safety4Kids</u> is a non-government website that has useful information and links. The <u>Constable Kenny website</u> also has several tips for parents of younger children.

If you become aware of an incident or notice anyone acting suspiciously around a school or student, contact police immediately on 131 444 or in the case of an emergency call 000. If you witness an incident or if you have any information that could assist police, contact Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000. Information can be provided anonymously. We would also ask that you notify the school so we can also support the wider school community to be aware of incidents.

TERM 2 IN KINDERGARTEN

This term kindergarten has been working incredibly hard developing their reading, writing and maths skills and it has been great to see everyone having a go and supporting each other.







Maths has been the focus of Play Workshop this term. The children have been investigating number through counting to and from 20, looking for patterns, exploring place value, skip counting, sorting and matching number names, numerals, and their quantities.







The children have been introduced to measurement through investigating length using informal units. They are developing an understanding of the need for formal units when measuring to ensure accuracy!











The children have also been having fun collecting data using tally marks and displaying the information they have collected. We have made picture graphs using information about our munch and crunch, the colour of cars driving past the school yard and our different eye colours.









We are so proud of the way the children are developing their writing skills. They are having a go and using the tools we have in our classrooms, including the word wall and sound charts.

The children are becoming experts in our interactive writing lessons, using the white boards to record their ideas and write sentences.





It is great to see so many children reading each night and changing their home readers. This supports the reading the children do in class each day. The children are beginning to use strategies to support them in their reading as they build on their letter/sound and high frequency word knowledge.



Finally, Kindergarten was very excited to help create a wonderful gift for our SLC, Emily Hartley, who is due to have her first baby in June.

Emily's last day was Friday, week 4 and the children were busy drawing a picture for Emily on fabric which we then turned into a quilt for her new bub.

PROTECTIVE BEHAVIOURS

Over the next term, children across P-2 are going to be getting smarter about the big idea of personal safety. Protective Behaviours is an education program that provides children and carers with information and strategies on how to identify and deal with unsafe and threatening situations. Protective Behaviours consists of ten lessons which will be taught across the school as part of our social and emotional learning program.

END OF MAY IS HATS OFF DAY

Cancer Council ACT coined the phrase - **End Of May is Hats Off Day** to assist Canberra schools and early childhood services with their hats on (and off) policy - incorporating a balanced approach to UV protection.

So, in keeping with the End of May is Hats Off Day jingle, all Canberra school students

(and teachers) can leave their hats at home or replace it with a beanie as we enter in the low UV June and July winter months.
