This term in Play Workshop the children have been learning about the different elements of drama and performance. The children have been working in small groups to create a story with a focus on characters, the setting and the storyline. They have collaboratively made props and backdrops to enhance their story. ### AFFILIATED SCHOOLS: TEACHERS AS RESEARCHERS PROGRAM

At Southern Cross, we are lucky to be a UC Affiliated school. The Affiliated Schools Program is a partnership between the University of Canberra (UC) and the ACT Government underpinned by a shared vision for Innovation, Research and Teacher Professional Development. This year a team of our teachers from preschool to year two have been working together to develop a Southern Cross philosophy about play. To create this vision, we have been collecting values and thoughts around play from our staff, children and community. Here are some of the questions we asked:

### When you play, what do you see, hear and feel?

### What do you recall about your play experiences from childhood? When you watch children play, what do you feel? What makes play so great?

We used word clouds to make sense of our data. Have a look below. The words that appear larger are the words that are repeated most often.

### Here's what our children think about play:

There are a few ways we can use this information. Our next steps are:

- To create a shared belief statement to share with our entire community.
- Develop a process to share this information with new and returning staff.
- Work with the P-2 teaching staff to make strong and authentic connections between Play and the Australian Curriculum.
- Reflect on our physical indoor and outdoor learning spaces and make changes for improvement.

In week 3 of this term, our team presented this work to other affiliated schools in the ACT directorate via the annual conference. It was a great way to share what we have learned through the process and celebrate the hard work that has been put into the project. We have committed to continuing this work around play in 2024. We will also welcome back our UC critical friend Dr Naomi Zouwer who has been instrumental in powering the research and planning behind this project.




- <u>Dads</u> of North Canberra.
