


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### Sharon Craft


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It's week 10!! We're sure we aren't the only ones excited that the school holidays are almost here!

## Representative Input Session on the return to school (hosted by the ACT Government)

Thank you to everyone who submitted responses to the questionnaire we sent out last week, seeking your views on the pathway out of lockdown. We received 51 responses from the SCECS community which was an amazing response, especially noting the tight time frame. Your answers helped us to represent SCECS and express the diversity of views in our community when we met with officials from the Education Directorate and ACT Health last Thursday. Education Minister Yvette Berry also attended and acknowledged the difficulty many parents and carers are facing right now.

The session involved parent/carer representatives from public schools across the ACT. It was very clear that parents are walking a tightrope between keeping themselves and their families safe, while wanting children to return to school as soon as possible, noting that home learning is difficult, and they're worried about lost learning and/or lost income. While there were very diverse views expressed and very different concerns for parents and carers of early childhood and primary school aged children, compared to those of high school and college aged children, the key recurring message was that parents want clear and early communication about the plans for returning to classrooms.

We are hoping the views of parents and carers are taken on board and we hear about the ACT Government's plans for Term 4 soon. We will also be discussing the results of the survey that we circulated with Kelly to ensure we pass on the views of the SCECS community and can provide as much support as possible as we make the transition back to face-to-face learning.
