UPDATE ON THE COLA (COVERED OUTDOOR LEARNING AREA)

Unfortunately, there were some unexpected delays over January, but we are on back on track and we are hoping the COLA will be complete by the end of this week or early next week. This area will allow families to stay dry at pick up and drop off when it rains, it also provides a wonderful, shaded area for the children at lunch and recess, and it will enable our whole school to be outside at lunch and recess when it rains.

RAINY DAYS

I would like to encourage all families to help their child pack gumboots, a raincoat, an umbrella (optional) and **a spare change of clothes** on rainy days (P-2). The children can play outside or have the choice to play under the COLA (K-2). This allows everyone to get some fresh air between learning sessions and will help us all to stay healthy.

AFFILIATED SCHOOLS - OUR PARTNERSHIP WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF CANBERRA

Over the last two years, Southern Cross Early Childhood School have had a strong partnership with the University of Canberra through the Affiliated Schools initiative. We are continuing this partnership in 2023 and our first engagement as a part of this initiative is to host PCK English Clinics at Southern Cross. On a Thursday morning from weeks 3-9 this term, we will host up to 20 UC pre-service teachers at our school. These pre-service teachers engage in their tutorial on our school site and then will work in small groups with some of our children in year 1/2 for up to 60 mins. We value this opportunity to support the learning of our pre-service teachers.

BASE ASSESSMENTS IN KINDERGARTEN

Each year in weeks 3 and 4 of term 1 and weeks 2 and 3 of term 4, our kindergarten children are engaged in BASE assessments with their teacher. The purpose of the assessment is to measure learning growth in reading and mathematics throughout the kindergarten year. The children will each spend time one on one with their teacher to support the engagement in this assessment. Kindergarten families will be provided with further information this week. Please do not hesitate to reach out and chat with us if you would like some additional information.

STAYING COVID SMART IN 2023

Being COVID Smart remains a priority for all ACT public schools in 2023.

Students, staff and visitors are reminded to:

- Stay home if unwell and get tested for COVID-19
- Stay up to date with your vaccinations
- Practise good hand and respiratory hygiene
- Physically distance from others when in public places

Individual schools may implement additional measures to manage COVID-19 if deemed necessary in a particular setting. Any changes will be communicated to parents and carers.

If your child has COVID-19, you must let the school know. We recommend keeping your child home for at least five days.

RATs are again available from the school for students in term 1 from the front office.

SAFE PARKING AROUND SCHOOLS

The start of the school year is a particularly busy time in our school carparks and surrounding streets. It's important that we park safely and legally to support the safety of students.

Parking on a footpath, nature strip or roadside verge can:

- Cause safety risks for pedestrians as they are less visible to oncoming cars
- Increase the risk for vulnerable members of our community like children, people who are visually impaired, and those using a wheelchair or pram
- Restrict the line of sight for other road users
- Restrict access for emergency services vehicles.

Parking on nature strips can also damage trees, footpaths, gutters and underground pipes and cables. Please also remember not to park across driveways or block neighbouring residents' properties.

As students return to school remember to also slow down and stick to the 40km/h limit around our schools between 8am and 4pm.

Parking inspectors regularly patrol school zones to support safe parking and keep students safe.

If you cannot find a car park in our school car parks, we suggest parking a little further away and walking or riding the rest of the way – it's a quick and easy was to get in some exercise too.

Let's all work together to keep our kids and community safe!

IMPORTANT HOUSEKEEPING

Contact Details: It is **vital** to have up to date contact information for each family with children enrolled at Southern Cross Early Childhood School.

If you have changed your address or updated your phone number please email <u>nicole.emerton@ed.act.edu.au</u> to ensure we have the current information.

Medical Information: Families are required to complete a new **Medical Information and Consent Form** each year. These will be emailed to families in Term 1, 2023.

Children with a **Known Medical Condition** are required to provide a current Medical Action Plan, completed by a medical professional, to the school on a yearly basis.

ABSENCE NOTIFICATIONS

If your child is away from school, you will receive an SMS to let you know your child has been recorded as absent. We will endeavour to send this message by 10.30am every day. This will reassure you of your child's arrival at school and make it easier for you to keep your child's attendance record up to date when they are absent.

Simply reply via SMS, with your child's name and the reason for your child's absence, your reply will be saved directly onto your child's attendance record. If you do not reply, your child's absence will be recorded as 'unexplained'.

- For **unexpected absences**, responding to the SMS will notify the school and be placed directly onto your child's attendance record.
- For **late arrival**, you may still receive an SMS in the morning, please sign in at reception and your child's attendance record will be updated to a partial attendance for that day.
- For **planned absences**, we would still appreciate advanced notice of your child's absence.

What is Drop In Clinic?

Child Development Service Clinics provide parents in the ACT with an opportunity to discuss concerns about their child's development with a Speech Pathologist, Occupational Therapist or Physiotherapist. These clinics take the form of an informal discussion and screen of skills; it is not an assessment. If assessment and/or intervention is recommended following the clinic, a referral will be made to the appropriate service.

Who should come to a Clinic?

Parents and guardians are welcome to attend a Drop In Clinic or call our Intake Service if they have concerns about their children in any of the following areas:

Please note that CDS Drop In Clinics are only available for children 0-6 years who have a residential address in the ACT and are not eligible for the National Disability Insurance Scheme.

Handwriting concerns, literacy, and numeracy concerns

Baby head shape, talipes, neck issues where there are no current concerns about development
