WHAT READING AND WRITING LOOKS LIKE AT SOUTHERN CROSS - READER'S AND WRITER'S WORKSHOP

Research tells us that if we want children to improve their reading and writing, then they need to spend most of their learning time engaged in meaningful reading and writing experiences. The Workshop Model allows for the teacher to explicitly teach and model a strategy or skill for one-third of the lesson time and for children to practice that strategy/skill for two-thirds of the lesson time.

Whilst children are reading and writing, the teacher will conference with individual children or work with a small group of children to provide feedback and to discuss individual reading and writing goals. A reflection is orchestrated at the end of the lesson to enable the children to reflect on their learning and consider what their focus may be for the lesson the following day.

KINDERGARTEN HAPPENINGS

We have had a great start to the year in kindergarten. Classes have been exploring the outdoor learning environment, the library and settling into school routines.

It has been wonderful to observe the children forming new friendships and reconnecting with their old friends.

During Play Workshop we have had a big focus on Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) through brainstorming, reading stories and role playing, 'What makes a good friend?' We explored how to ask a friend to join in play and investigated solving problems such as, 'What could you do if a friend doesn't want to play





with you?' We currently have a focus on using kind words and building resilience.

During these workshop sessions we have also been incorporating the Learning Assets of being an effective 'communicator' and 'collaborator' by discussing and brainstorming what these assets look like, feel like and sound like when playing with others.







Play Workshop is linked to our Humanities and Social Science (HASS) unit which focuses on exploring our unique and individual identities. We will do this by investigating the questions, 'What is your passion and why?' We will then identify the significant people and events in our lives and explore a range of different events and celebrations that are significant to us.





The children have been introduced to our Reader's Workshop model, exploring a variety of texts, songs, and rhymes. They have been developing their reading strategies, focussing on the 3 ways to read a book, and building their stamina when reading, looking for high frequency words and learning about letter/sound relationships.







During Writer's Workshop the children have been exploring the concept of writing. They have been investigating letters, words, and sentences. Through modelled, shared, and interactive writing the children write for a variety of purposes every day.







Kindergarten has been exploring the concept of numbers during Maths Workshop. By engaging in a variety of handson activities such as number hunts, quality literature, using number lines, counters and blocks, the children have been exploring numeral recognition, number value, subitising (instant recognition of a small collection) and number formation.







We look forward to a productive year with all of the children and kindergarten families.

EARTH HOUR - SATURDAY 23 MARCH - 8.30PM

Earth Hour started in Sydney in 2007 and has since grown to become the world's largest movement for the environment, with over 190 countries and territories participating annually to raise awareness!

Earth Hour has grown to become much more than switching your lights off, but that iconic switch-off moment is still an important part of Earth Hour. Millions of participants around the world will switch off their lights at 8:30 pm local time on Saturday 23rd March to demonstrate their support of the environment. This action is symbolic and is not an action to save power. We know it will take so much more than an hour of turning our lights out to have a measurable impact on climate change, but the action helps to bring greater awareness to the issue and demonstrates your commitment to help protect the planet – both during and beyond Earth Hour.

The world's biggest landmarks, like the Empire State Building, London Bridge and Australia's own Sydney Opera House and Harbour Bridge, switch off each year as a symbolic display of their commitment to the planet.

PARENT PORTAL - LAUCHING TODAY

Parent Portal, a secure online platform used to share student information between you and your child's teachers, will be available today.

Using the Parent Portal on your mobile phone, tablet or computer, you will be able to:

- notify us if your child is sick or explain an absence
- book parent-teacher interviews
- receive academic reports
- receive our school newsletter
- receive messages from your child's teachers
- make payments
- access the school calendar and your child's student timetable.

One of the many benefits of the Parent Portal is that it will be used by all ACT public schools from preschool through to year 12, so there will be no need to use a different system as children change schools during their public-school journey. If you have children at nearby schools you will not need to sign up to the system twice. You will be able to easily add a student to your account once their school has access to the Parent Portal.

SIGN UP NOW

To access the portal, you will need to create or have access to an ACT Government Digital Account. You can sign up now and complete the **level 2** identity verification process to get ready for our launch.

To complete the identity verification process, you will need one of the following:

- Driver's licence
- Australian Passport
- Birth certificate
- Australian citizenship certificate
- Change of name certificate
- Marriage certificate
- ImmiCard
- Australian visa
- Medicare
- Centrelink Concession Card
